ECC Ministry of Prayer

As we walk through this fall season, we want to take some time each Sunday during the service to reflect and turn our attention to Jesus in prayer. We'll practice different ways of praying each Sunday as we grow together as a congregation in our prayer life with Jesus.

Why are we doing this?

By praying together, we strengthen the times when we pray and meet with Jesus in solitude. By praying together, we train and equip each other in different ways to encounter the Lord in prayer. By praying together, we join together as one body in unity for one purpose, to bring glory to Jesus as Lord.

It is our hope, as we practice praying together more that we would be challenged, encouraged and inspired to live lives that are saturated in prayer and worship not just on Sundays but in and through our whole lives.

Prayer can sometimes be an uncomfortable thing, and if you're in that place – that's okay! We are challenging each other in this direction as a church so all of us can grow in our prayer lives with God and become more in tune with his spirit.

It's not about having the right words, or sounding poetic, or bursting into prophecy, it's about being honest and vulnerable with one another and with Jesus.
