It is with glad hearts that we report what has been happening over the last year. As a committee, we take our responsibility very seriously as we seek to follow God's will for Eastview, and to steward. His resources wisely.

The purchase of One88, as well as some renovations (a result of some water back up a couple years ago) are complete. We had our taxes reassessed and are 100% tax exempt which saves us about 21k per year. We are thankful for that change.

We are aware that some bigger renovations will need to happen to upgrade both locations, as well as to consider needs of our different ministries. We are discerning which projects need to happen first, and plan to use designated restricted funds (from the sale of property on Sperring Road) to fund these projects.

We engaged in a joint meeting with Leadership Board and felt unity around the table. We do not take that for granted, and thank God for what He is doing among us. One ofthe things we affirmed in December was a decision to hire a Pastor of Adult Discipleship. We also want to welcome Helen Bell who is doing some contract cleaning of our church.

We have been encouraged to find out that last year there was a significant increase in receipted donations in 2015 over the previous year. We are thankful to God for that increase, and know that we give out of our hearts

The goal of Kingdom Builders is to experience the life-changing power of Jesus, be equipped and supported to share the good news of the gospel in our schools, places of work, and with our families!


